TYPE OF EXAMINATION

An **open-competitive** register will be established. Qualified applicants will be evaluated based on their training and experience as shown on their applications. The evaluation of training and experience will comprise 100% of the final grade.

QUALIFICATIONS NEEDED TO APPLY

You must have **all** of the following to qualify:

- High School Diploma or GED
- Three (3) years of experience as a field inspector in weights and measures inspection, including one (1) year of supervisory experience in a weights and measures laboratory using the National Bureau of Standards Auditing Program.

KIND OF WORK

This is specialized administrative and laboratory work involving the calibration of weights and measure standards and equipment. The employee in this class is responsible for the precise calibration of mass, volume, and length standards used in inspecting industries, institutions, and governmental agencies. Work includes providing technical assistance in metrology, supervising laboratory staff, and serving as an expert witness in court on truck weighing cases. Work is performed within the broad framework of existing laws, regulations, and policies and is subject to a general review by an administrative superior through conferences and reports.

HOW TO APPLY

Use an Application for Examination form. You can get the form at this office or at any local Alabama Career Center office. It can also be downloaded from our web site. You must send your application to the State Personnel Department. It must be received by the close of business on **August 29, 2007**. Applications received after this date **WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED**. The names of those who apply late will be put on a mailing list to be notified when this job is again open for applications. The State Personnel Department is not responsible for late receipt of applications due to mail services or fax malfunctions. Photocopied applications are accepted. Individuals currently on the register MUST reapply to remain eligible for employment.

Except for pretest information provided by State Personnel to all applicants, you should not directly or indirectly obtain information about examinations. If you do, the State Personnel Director may do several things. One, you may not be given an examination. Two, you may be disqualified after an examination. Three, your name may be removed from a register. Or four, your name may not be certified from the register. (Rules of the State Personnel Board, Chapter 670-x-9). According to the Code of Alabama, 36-26-47, a willful violation of exam security is a misdemeanor. Any person who is convicted of this type of misdemeanor will not get a state job. If they are officers or employees of the state, they will be required to forfeit their office or position for five years.
