JOB INFORMATION

The ABC Product/Stores Assistant Division Director is a permanent full-time position with the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board. Positions are currently located in Montgomery, Mobile, and Birmingham. Employees in this class assist in planning and directing the retailing and wholesaling of all liquors through the state stores system.

MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS

You **must** have **all** of the following to qualify for the **promotional** register:

- Current permanent status with the ABC Board in a classification at or above the level of ABC Operations Supervisor as of the closing date of September 28, 2011.
- Completion of at least two years of college from an accredited* college/institution preferably in business administration or a related field
- Two years of experience in planning and directing ABC stores or warehouse operations

You **must** have **all** of the following to qualify for the **open-competitive** register:

- Bachelor's degree from an accredited* college or university in business administration or a closely related field
- Two years of managerial experience in purchasing, in-bound transportation, warehousing, distribution, and auditing distribution systems in retail/wholesale operations

NOTE

- Experience above the required minimum may substitute for up to two years of the required education

EXAMINATION

- **Open-Competitive** to all applicants; **Promotional** to current state employees
- An Evaluation of **Training and Experience** as shown on application will comprise 100% of the final score for the open-competitive register. An Evaluation of Training and Experience will comprise 95% of the applicant's final score for the promotional register, with the remaining 5% being based on the average of the applicant's service ratings for the last three years.

HOW TO APPLY

- Complete an Application for Examination Form available at www.personnel.alabama.gov, the above address, or any Alabama Career Center Office.
- Apply on-line, by mail, or by fax.

*Individuals currently on the register **MUST** reapply to remain eligible for employment.
Veteran's credits are **NOT** allowed on promotional examinations.*

*Please refer to the back of this announcement for complete information on State Personnel's policy for accepting post-secondary and advanced degrees.

Except for pretest information provided by State Personnel to all applicants, you should not directly or indirectly obtain information about examinations. If you do, the State Personnel Director may do several things. One, you may not be given an examination. Two, you may be disqualified after an examination. Three, your name may be removed from a register. Or four, your name may not be certified from the register. (Rules of the State Personnel Board, Chapter 670-x-9). According to the Code of Alabama, 36-26-47, a willful violation of exam security is a misdemeanor. Any person who is convicted of this type of misdemeanor will not get a state job. If they are officers or employees of the state, they will be required to forfeit their office or position for five years.

If you know of anyone who has violated this policy, you should contact the Examination Manager at the State Personnel Department.

State of Alabama Personnel Department Policy on Accepting College Coursework, Post-Secondary and Advanced Degrees

1. Specific college coursework required for a job, as well as Bachelor's, graduate, post graduate, and doctoral degrees will be accepted from the schools accredited by any of the six regional accreditation associations in the United States. These associations are listed below.

- Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS)
- Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools (MSA)
- Northwest Commission on Colleges and Universities (NWCCU)
- North Central Association of Colleges and Schools – The Higher Learning Commission (NCA-HLC)
- New England Association of Schools and Colleges – Commission on Institutions of Higher Education (NEASC-CIHE)
- Western Association of Schools and Colleges – Accrediting Commission for Senior Colleges and Universities (WASC-ACSCU)

2. Coursework or degrees from schools that have not been accredited by a regional accreditation association will be accepted if a regionally accredited school considers the coursework or degree to be an acceptable prerequisite for admission to an advanced degree program. For example, if a regionally accredited school accepts an applicant's bachelor's degree for admittance into a graduate degree program, State Personnel will accept the degree. In the case of required college coursework (but no degree requirement), State Personnel will accept the college coursework if a regionally accredited school accepts the coursework towards a post-secondary degree (e.g., a bachelor's degree). **This must be documented by a letter of acceptance from the regionally accredited school.** State Personnel will review such requests on a case-by-case basis.

Note: This policy is subject to change. Certain state agencies may have additional requirements.
