#### **TYPE OF EXAMINATION**

A **promotional** and an **open-competitive** register will be established for this job classification. Qualified applicants will be evaluated based on their training and experience as shown on their application. Individuals who have current, permanent status as a Pipeline Safety Investigations Supervisor or a Pipeline Safety Investigator, Senior will qualify for the promotional register. For the promotional register, the final score from this evaluation of training and experience will comprise 95% of the final grade, with average service ratings from the last three years comprising the remaining 5%. For the open-competitive register, scores derived from the evaluation will comprise 100% of the final grade.

#### **QUALIFICATIONS NEEDED TO APPLY**

**You must have all of the following to qualify:**

- Bachelor's degree from an accredited\* four-year college or university in Engineering.
- Six years of responsible experience in the regulation, maintenance, operations, or engineering fields of a natural gas, hazardous liquid, or other gas pipeline system.

#### **NOTES**

- Experience above the required minimum may substitute for the required degree on a year-for-year basis.
- Applicants must possess a valid Alabama driver's license at the time of appointment.
- Extensive statewide and nationwide overnight travel is required.

#### **KIND OF WORK**

This is responsible administrative and technical work enforcing safety standards for the transportation of natural gas, hazardous liquid, and other gas by pipelines. Employees in this class are responsible for planning, implementing and supervising a program designed to control the handling, storing and distribution of natural, hazardous liquid, and other gas. Work involves the planning and development of safety standards and methods for inspecting and testing to determine compliance with federal safety standards.

#### **HOW TO APPLY**

Use an Application for Examination form. You can get the form at this office or at an Alabama Career Center office. It can also be downloaded from our web site. You must send your application to the State Personnel Department. It must be received by the close of business on **January 30, 2008**. Applications received after this date **WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED**. The names of those who apply late will be put on a mailing list to be notified when this job is again open for applications. The State Personnel Department is not responsible for late receipt of applications due to mail services or fax malfunctions. Photocopied applications are accepted. Except for pretest information provided by State Personnel to all applicants, you should not directly or indirectly obtain information about examinations. If you do, the State Personnel Director may do several things. One, you may not be given an examination. Two, you may be disqualified after an examination. Three, your name may be removed from a register. Or four, your name may not be certified from the register. (Rules of the State Personnel Board, Chapter 670-x-9). According to the Code of Alabama, 36-26-47, a willful violation of exam security is a misdemeanor. Any person who is convicted of this type of misdemeanor will not get a state job. If they are officers or employees of the state, they will be required to forfeit their office or position for five years.

#### **Policy on Accepting College Coursework, Post-Secondary and Advanced Degrees**

1. Specific college coursework required for a job, as well as Bachelor's, graduate, post graduate, and doctoral degrees will be accepted from the schools accredited by any of the six regional accreditation associations in the United States. These associations are listed below.

- Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS)
- Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools (MSA)
- Northwest Commission on Colleges and Universities (NWCCU)
- North Central Association of Colleges and Schools – The Higher Learning Commission (NCA-HLC)
- New England Association of Schools and Colleges – Commission on Institutions of Higher Education (NEASC-CIHE)
- Western Association of Schools and Colleges – Accrediting Commission for Senior Colleges and Universities (WASC-ACSCU)

2. Coursework or degrees from schools that have not been accredited by a regional accreditation association will be accepted if a regionally accredited school considers the coursework or degree to be an acceptable prerequisite for admission to an advanced degree program. For example, if a regionally accredited school accepts an applicant's bachelor's degree for admittance into a graduate degree program, State Personnel will accept the degree. In the case of required college coursework (but no degree requirement), State Personnel will accept the college coursework if a regionally accredited school accepts the coursework towards a post-secondary degree (e.g., a bachelor's degree). **This must be documented by a letter of acceptance from the regionally accredited school.** State Personnel will review such requests on a case-by-case basis.

Note: This policy is subject to change. Certain state agencies may have additional requirements.
