JOB INFORMATION

The Agriculture and Industries Program Director is a permanent full-time position with the Department of Agriculture and Industries. Positions are located in Montgomery. This is responsible administrative work in directing activities of statewide programs.

MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS

You **must** have **all** of the following to qualify for the **open-competitive** register:

- Bachelor's degree from an accredited* college or university in Agricultural Science, Agribusiness, Animal Science, Biological Science, Dairy Science, Physical Science, Agricultural Education, Food Science, Poultry Science, Botany, Plant Pathology, Entomology, or a closely related field.
- Six (6) years of experience developing agricultural marketing plans or performing *inspection/enforcement* or *compliance review* activities in one or more of the following program areas: weights and measures, livestock/poultry, food and drug inspection, agriculture marketing, gins and warehouses, meat inspection, pesticide, plant protection, or seed analysis including two (2) years of experience in the supervision and management of a program area.

You **must** have **all** of the following to qualify for the **promotional** register:

- Current, permanent status as a Agriculture and Industries Unit Manager (70116) with the State Merit System
- Bachelor's degree from an accredited* college or university in Agricultural Science, Agribusiness, Animal Science, Biological Science, Dairy Science, Physical Science, Agricultural Education, Food Science, Poultry Science, Botany, Plant Pathology, Entomology, or a closely related field.
- Six (6) years of experience developing agricultural marketing plans or performing *inspection/enforcement* or *compliance review* activities in one or more of the following program areas: weights and measures, livestock/poultry, food and drug inspection, agriculture marketing, gins and warehouses, meat inspection, pesticide, plant protection, or seed analysis including two (2) years of experience in the supervision and management of a program area.

Note: Applicants who do not meet the above educational requirement may substitute appropriate full-time experience on a year-for-year basis (e.g., one-year of experience equals one year of education). One year of substituted experience is equivalent to 30 semester or 45 quarter hours of college coursework (*please list appropriate coursework on application*).

EXAMINATION

- **Open-Competitive** to all applicants, **Promotional** to current state employees in the classification listed above.
- An Evaluation of **Training and Experience** as shown on application will comprise 100% of the final score for the open competitive register and 95% of the final score for the promotional register. The remaining 5% will be based on the average of the applicant's service ratings for the last three years.

- Apply on-line, by mail, or by fax.

*Individuals currently on the register MUST reapply to remain eligible for employment.
Veteran's credits are NOT allowed on promotional examinations.*

*Please refer to the back of this announcement for complete information on State Personnel's policy for accepting post-secondary and advanced degrees.

Except for pretest information provided by State Personnel to all applicants, you should not directly or indirectly obtain information about examinations. If you do, the State Personnel Director may do several things. One, you may not be given an examination. Two, you may be disqualified after an examination. Three, your name may be removed from a register. Or four, your name may not be certified from the register. (Rules of the State Personnel Board, Chapter 670-x-9). According to the Code of Alabama, 36-26-47, a willful violation of exam security is a misdemeanor. Any person who is convicted of this type of misdemeanor will not get a state job. If they are officers or employees of the state, they will be required to forfeit their office or position for five years.

If you know of anyone who has violated this policy, you should contact the Examination Manager at the State Personnel Department.

Applicants hired by the State of Alabama on or after January 1, 2012 will be subject to the E-Verify process pursuant to Act No. 2011-535.

State of Alabama Personnel Department Policy on Accepting College Coursework, Post-Secondary and Advanced Degrees

1. Specific college coursework required for a job, as well as Bachelor's, graduate, post graduate, and doctoral degrees will be accepted from the schools accredited by any of the six regional accreditation associations in the United States. These associations are listed below.

- Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS)
- Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools (MSA)
- Northwest Commission on Colleges and Universities (NWCCU)
- North Central Association of Colleges and Schools – The Higher Learning Commission (NCA-HLC)
- New England Association of Schools and Colleges – Commission on Institutions of Higher Education (NEASC-CIHE)
- Western Association of Schools and Colleges – Accrediting Commission for Senior Colleges and Universities (WASC-ACSCU)

2. Coursework or degrees from schools that have not been accredited by a regional accreditation association will be accepted if a regionally accredited school considers the coursework or degree to be an acceptable prerequisite for admission to an advanced degree program. For example, if a regionally accredited school accepts an applicant's bachelor's degree for admittance into a graduate degree program, State Personnel will accept the degree. In the case of required college coursework (but no degree requirement), State Personnel will accept the college coursework if a regionally accredited school accepts the coursework towards a post-secondary degree (e.g., a bachelor's degree). **This must be documented by a letter of acceptance from the regionally accredited school.** State Personnel will review such requests on a case-by-case basis.

Note: This policy is subject to change. Certain state agencies may have additional requirements.
